Children and Worship

Worship Care for children, birth through kindergarten, is available during the worship hour in the Children's Building, rooms 216, 217, and 218. Children, first grade and older, worship with their families in the Sanctuary. Children's worship bulletins, crayons, and books are available on the cart in the foyer outside the Sanctuary.

Sunday Morning Bible Study Classes

Every Sunday morning at 8:45 am, there are small group gatherings for all ages. These groups meet for fellowship and Bible study. Classes for children and youth are offered by age; classes for adults are offered by ages and life-stages or by topical interests.

How to Join VHBC

Any person may join this congregation on the basis of their affirmation of Jesus Christ as Lord. You may communicate your desire for church membership by coming to the front of the Sanctuary during the closing hymn, by meeting privately with a member of our pastoral staff, or by placing a connect card from the pew rack in the offering plate. After meeting with the pastor, new members will be introduced on Sunday morning or Wednesday evening.

An individual may come on *profession of faith*, which means you believe in Christ as Lord and Savior and wish to be baptized and become part of this church. One may also come on *transfer of letter* from another church having received Christian baptism, or by *statement of your faith* in Christ and Christian baptism in another church.





Extending the Sermon

Sunday, May 5, 2024 6th Sunday of Easter

Title: Holy Interruptions Primary Scripture: Acts 10:44-48 2nd Scripture Reading: 1 John 5:1-6

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. Acts 10:44 (NRSV)

Reflection: What Holy Interruptions in the story of Peter and the Centurian stand out to you?

The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Acts 10:45-46 (NRSV)

Reflection: Where have you been astonished by a Holy Interruption in your life? How did you respond?

Peter said, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" Acts 10:45-46 (NRSV)

Reflection: Name a step you might take to be more open to the Spirit's interruptions in your life.

2024 PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND

Because of the generous response of church members over the past eight years, the Permanent Endowment Fund ended 2024 with over \$827,000 in assets. 


